Fishing Report...



Winter is almost upon us and the water temperature is in the 60s. This changes our tactics for fishing as the fish migrate to follow their food.

Sheepshead and black drum are legal to keep and can be found around docks and brides, use shrimp or fiddler crabs to get them. Red fish and trout are schooled up and can be caught as catch and release only, so carefully release them.

Offshore gag grouper are legal to keep until the end of December, grunts, snapper, and black seabass will be found in the same spots. Use live pinfish for the grouper and squid or cut baits for the other fish, all are great to eat.

Go out on the water, be safe and have fun!


Book Club...


The new key will operate ONLY the east (marina side) door. When you lock the building, lock the west door from the INSIDE and lock the east door with the KEY.
