

# Dunedin Boat Club - Notice of Race 2008 Series (Updated 8.21.08, change in bold)

## 1. Rules

1.1 These series shall be governed by the rules as defined in the current edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), or as modified by the Dunedin Sailing Instructions.

1.2 The following documents also apply:

Notice of Race (this document)

Dunedin Sailing Instruction

West Florida PHRF, Inc. class rules, appendix "E", Cruising Class racing.

## 2. Classes

2.1 All races are being run in one class; "True Cruising Class". The class flag is WHITE.

2.2 Divisions may be established based on quantity of boats, and boat sizes.

## 3. Eligibility

3.1 All keelboats, **dingies, multihulls** that meet the safety requirements as specified in the rules may participate. (change)

3.2 To encourage participation; no rating certificate is required.

3.4. **It is encouraged that all sailors have current ratings for their boats, if they wish to participate in other regional programs.** (change)

3.4.1 A WF-PHRF certificate will be honored if it has been issued within the current year.

#### **4. Schedule of Races; Registration; Fees**

4.1 For 2008, the DBC Race Committee will hold three series; spring's "North of the Bridge", summer's "St. Josephs Sound", and fall's "Gulf" Racing.

4.1.1 "North of the Bridge", Spring 2008 (March-June)

4.1.2 Saint Josephs Sound ("Bay Racing") Summer 2008 (July-August)

**Series complete, see web site for results. (change)**

4.1.3 Gulf of Mexico, ("Gulf Racing") fall 2008 (Sept, Oct, and November)

Location: Approx ½ mile south of the number 1 mark of "hurricane" pass.

Course: All courses will be based on the "Kaneski" course(s) or the "**Dunedin Cup**" star course. Course coordinates are described in attachment "B" to this Notice of Race Series. Mark rounding order will be issued by Committee boat over channel 76, and by signs posted on the both port and starboard sides of the committee boat.

Dates: **September 6<sup>th</sup>**, October 25<sup>th</sup>, and November 8<sup>th</sup>.

Time: 11am.

Number of Races: One. One race constitutes a series.

4.2 A Skippers\Racer\Crew meetings will be held on **the day of the race**. At such time your registration fee of **\$5.00** per "race day" will be due. This will pay for equipment upkeep, post race refreshments and snacks for skipper and crew.

4.2.1. Online check in is available at [www.dunedinboatclub.org](http://www.dunedinboatclub.org), 72 hours prior to a race.

4.2.2. Telephone check in is available at 727-688-1631 within 72 hours of the race. Please leave the skippers name, boat name, and if it is your first race with us the make, model and year of your boat.

4.3 If you are unable to attend the meeting, use online or phone check in, you may check in at the committee boat on race day. Your race instructions will be visual/sound signals from the committee boat. Skippers choosing this method can pay the registration fee at the post race party.

## **5. Scoring and Prizes**

5.1 Each race will be scored according to the Sailing Instructions.

5.2 “Racing Sailor of the Year” awards will go to sailor with the lowest overall point average. Each sailor must compete in at least six races for the year. The best six races will be used to compute the average.

5.2.1. A sailor does not need to be on the same boat for each race. The race boats points will be awarded to that sailor.

5.3 “Race Boat of the Year” awards will go to the boat owner with the lowest overall point average. Each boat must compete in at least six races. The best six races will be used to compute the average.
