

Race Committee 101 Training

The 2022 regatta season is gearing up and we need your help! Whether you are new to sailboat racing or have some experience, you will find this newly updated class informative.

Why is it important? It takes a minimum of 7 boats and 20 committee members each day to properly staff a race course for the world class regattas in Clearwater that CYC and surrounding clubs are know for and there may be more than 1 course each day. Our region has a reputation for having some of the best conditions in the world for racing, and our collective support of sailboat racing brings much prestige to our individual clubs and

Why do we need to help? We are continutally building our stable of excellent and experienced race committee members who can organize and run good regattas. Every major event we host needs power boats for almost every position on the race course, including safety boats. We need expert power boat drivers with good navigation and radio communication skills and people who enjoy being on the water. Without good powerboat support we simply cannot run a regatta! And we need landside volunteers too – up to 10 daily to assist wth registration, picking up and distributing food and water, prepping the equipment that will be used on the water each day, and working "beachside" to help launch the competitors.

How good are the sailors? Well, it depends on the event. In the Olympic class regattas (US Open) you will see some of the top sailors in the world. Then, at the Sunfish Masters, you will see sailors in their 80's competing! In our big boat races (Clearwater Challenge, Pass-A-Grille Run, Dundedin Cup, DBC Winter and Fall Series) we typically attract local cruiser/racer designs with families and friends crewing together and who generally have much more modest racing aspirations, but really know how to enjoy the pre and post race parties.

Will I have fun? If you volunteer your boat and come out on the racecourse you can count on a good time. We will always assign experienced crew to be on the racecourse with you and afterwards we all meet up at the bar to relax and trade stories about the day.

Coffee will be available at 8:30 a.m.
A light lunch will be served immediately following the training

Book Club...


The Book Club's next meeting is Wed. February 9, at 7pm. Sign up on the Event section of the Boat Club website.

Fishing Report...

The cold fronts come and go this time of the year, changing fishing conditions almost daily. Sheepshead are easy to find around any structure such as bridges, docks, and rocky areas. Mud and fiddler crabs on a very sharp #1 hook with splitshot work great! They are great to eat and must be at least 12 inches to keep. Pieces of shrimp and sand fleas also work. We pulled our ten stone crab traps and came up with only 3 keeper claws. If the next round doesn't produce more we will move our traps. Triple tail can be found on the trap buoys and will take a live shrimp or whitebait, we saw two small ones on one of our buoys. Triple tail must be 18 inches to keep! Watch the weather, pick your days, and be careful when fishing cold waters. February we will do a silver and spotted sea trout event. Watch our website for more details. Forum has been set up for fishing enthusiasts.

January Highlight Chris Gattas

Member Since 2001

Hello fellow boat club members, I was asked by Jeanine to write a few paragraphs for the insight article in the Harbor Crier so here goes. I am one of those rare folks who was born and raised here in Florida, Morton Plant Hospital to be

exact. My childhood home was at 2229 Donato Drive in Belleair Beach, I attended mostly public schools starting with Anona Elementary and ending with my graduation from Largo High, with a brief stop at Belleair Montosori in fourth grade because Mildred Helms elementary failed to teach me to read.

My love of the water began at 2 years old when my mother told me I learned to swim rather accidentally on a routine outing to the 19th street beach access on Belleair Beach. My older sister forgot she was supposed to be watching me while my mother went to the car to get our cooler for lunch. When my mother returned in what she said was less than 5 minutes my sister was hard at work on a sandcastle, and I was swimming out to sea. My love of sailing began at 8 years old, my mom and dad were divorced by then and I was introduced to the Big Brothers organization, which we know now as Big Brothers Big Sisters. I was paired with a 23 year old named Larry who became my big brother, Larry worked for sailmakers Ratsey & Lapthorn, he taught me to sail in a Dyer Dhow, which is very similar to the Optimist Pram. Larry moved to California, and then Thailand after 5 years of being my big brother but I kept sailing. I moved



up to larger more responsive boat called a Laser in high school and began to race, I loved it and when one of my friends father asked me to crew on their 22' Morgan (Zephyr) and race in a local club called Windjammers I was hooked.

I met my next love about that same time at Ponderosa Steak House on Missouri Ave in Largo. Tracie my high school sweetheart and wife of 35 years started dating September 3rd 1982 and took me away from sailing for awhile. Tracie and I married May 17th 1986 and as a young couple just getting started there was not much time or money for sailing. Our son Phillip was born Jan. 6th 1991 and raising a child left even less time and money for sailing. Then low and behold in 1996 Tracie asked me what I thought about buying a small sailboat for the family and teaching Phillip to sail, that is when 3G's was born! For those that don't know the Gattas family, 3G's was our first sailboat an S2 7.3 meter. Tracie,



Phillip and I had quite an adventure bringing her home from the Gandy Marina in St. Pete. In 2001 we were invited to join the DBC by a fellow S2 owner named Jim Tilges, Jim and Carl Young got me racing again, and in 2004 Tracie and I won the boat of the year award with 3G's, she was a fast boat and with a 4' draft for her 23' length she pointed like an arrow!

Fast forward to 2006 I became commodore of the club, as you may know the incoming commodore is Santa Claus at the Christmas Boat Parade. I have to say being Santa was one of my favorite parts of being commodore. I was also our lead Pig Vampire for the DBC pig roast for 10+ years? Jack Mallard can tell you the exact number. My journey to commodore started as membership chair, and at that time I remember writing an article about the benefits to membership. We may not have the amenities of a yacht club, but the friendships we forge with fellow members, the sailing, fishing, social events, community outreach, etc. make the DBC a value like no other!



I think I can start bringing this article to an end. The definition of insight is to gain a deep understanding of a person or thing. As I am writing this I realize it is both. It has given you some insight into past commodore Chris Gattas, and it has given me some insight on the DBC and how it has shaped my life and Tracie's life for the past 20 years. Tracie and I have both become captains as a result of our love of the water and the friends in the DBC that supported us, went through captains training with us, and

introduced us to opportunities to use those captains licenses. I hope that this might inspire those reading to embrace the many facets of the DBC, I am sure that there are future boat of the year winners, commodores, captains, etc. among you!




