#### Where Have All the Boats Gone? ...

As the dredging began, I was curious as to where all the boats in the marina went. There were only about 34 boats left in the marina out of nearly 200. As about 88 of the slip renters were DBC members, I sent out a survey by email to satisfy my curiosity. I received answers within 3 days and then no one else replied.

Kan Blaine bought a trailer in order to store his boat in the church parking lot across from the marina. Rod and Cindy Collman decided to do some extended cruising during this time, ending up at a marina in Ft. Meyers until they are able to return to their slip. Manny and Maryellen Farinas also took this opportunity to cruise. The remainder of the boats found spots as far north as Tarpon Springs and as far south as Gulfport. Most of the boats took slips in the Clearwater area, either behind people's homes or at local marinas. The majority were paying \$100-200 more at their temporary location than they were at Dunedin, mainly because they were non-residents in the area of the marina. Very few were planning to use their boats to explore the area around their new slip during the time the boat was there. Some were not planning to use their boats at all until they returned to Dunedin. I myself having been

using my boat at least once a week, finding it a great way to keep sane during this pandemic. Island Hopper is at Island Yacht Club Marina on Island Estates, right down from the aquarium, along with several other boats from DBC. It is interesting that the time to get out to the gulf is almost exactly the same amount of time it takes to get to the gulf from Dunedin Marina as one has to go all around Island Estates if you have a sail boat. I look with envy at the short bridge to the south of the marina as power boats can zip through there and are out in the gulf in 10 minutes! It is the drive to the marina that is a big difference as depending upon the traffic going to the beach, it can be a 20 minute drive or an hour and a half. Along with everyone else, we are looking forward to being tucked back into our slip at Dunedin.

## Fishing Report...

Pasco County Scallop season opens on Friday July 17th through Saturday July 26th. You must be north of the Anclote River and display a diver down flag from your vessel. Limit is 2 gallons whole per person or 10 gallons whole per vessel, whichever is less. A saltwater license is required to take scallops!

Remember, speckled trout, redfish, and snook are strictly catch and release thru May 31st of 2021. Inshore flounder, black drum, silver trout, sheepshead, and pompano are available to take home for a meal.

Offshore both gag and red grouper are available for harvest, gags must measure 24 inches and reds 20". Spanish mackerel are available close to shore and triple tail as well as cobia can be found hanging around the crab trap floats.

Go out on the water, be safe and have fun!

## **Book Club...**


The Book Club is on hiatus but we are still reading!






