During this dredge please remember there is no access to the West wall. It is part of a construction zone. Special permissions are required to enter. This includes access by boat as well. Please check with Harbormaster Laurie if there is an issue or emergency. Once this is all over we may all have some fun stories to share about the relocations! Hopefully good stories:)

Our clubhouse kitchen is looking amazing and nearly completed! Thank you to Randy, Bob, the building committee and all that helped. Once we are back to normal it is going to get a lot of use. Looking forward to that.



The Book Club is on hiatus but we are still reading!




Carnegie's Maid: A Novel, Marie Benedict






