



The Race Committee was able to get in two races with the help of John Fondrk and Rebecca Porter on Knot Sure serving as Signal. The 3rd and final race of the Fall Regatta is schedule for November 21st which will bring the 3-race date Regatta to a close AND when included with the Winter Regatta earlier this year, brings our 2020 Gulf Series to a close. We want to thank in advance, Harold & Lucindy Schomaker for volunteering their 37' Gulfstar Maxine as our Signal Vessel on the 21st and Race Committee Crew of Sheryl Barnes, Dan Johnson Carol Elwood & David Kresge.

**VOLUNTEERS** will be needed in February 2021. *Our DBC member Fairlie Brinkley, who is also a US Sailing National Principal Race Officer,* is leading the charge to bring to Clearwater the 2021 Olympic Class Races in February. 
The new key will operate ONLY the east (marina side) door. When you lock the building, lock the west door from the INSIDE and lock the east door with the KEY.

## Fishing Report...

I just came back from fishing a half mile off St Pete Beach and found all the Spanish mackerel you could ask for up to 26 inches in length. We cast netted some white baits inshore and then anchored and chummed with live whitebaits we netted.

In two hours we had all the fish we wanted for the smoker and to eat fresh that night. We used 30# mono leader with long shank chrome 3/0 hooks on light inshore rods and fished from 7am till 9am. No kings were seen as I believe they are still further offshore.

On the way in we checked the near shore crab pot buoys and found small tripletail around them. None were of legal size which is 18 inches. Next month we should see bigger tripletail!

We had a flat wave condition, however the tropical storm on the way may move the bait and macks offshore until conditions improve.

Call me if you have any ideas for a fishing event. Go out on the water, be safe and have fun!

The Book Club is testing small group meetings and Zoom sessions. We hope to have meeting options established for the start of the new year.


In the meantime, here is a recommendation from one of our Book Club members.
