September is a busy month with the start of the DBC Gulf Series – Fall Regatta on September 12th. The good news is we were ready to go. Race Committee disbursed the gear on Friday to the Signal vessel, Geronimo (Jim Davis) and Island Hopper had the marks for setting the course for a 12-noon start. We had boats and crew registered on Yacht Scoring and this thing called a Tropical Storm Watch starting to show its head. As you know our skippers want to race and so we were excited. At 3:15 AM Saturday morning the winds were forecast to be blowing in the 15-18kt range with gusts to 21. But at 6:15 AM it was listed as 18-19 knots with gusts in the 25-28 range. The race was called and we were able to confirm that all boats got the message. When Jim Davis, Carol Elwood and David Kresge came down to the docks at 8 AM to unload the equipment and return it to the Clubhouse the air was light and the sky above was blue. DID we make a mistake? But at 12:15 which would be right after the start. Dunedin was under significant rain and winds were blowing in the 18 – 21 range. Whew to say the least. We were sad but relieved. There are two race dates left for the Winter Regatta in October and November.

The Dunedin Cup is a go for September 26th and all the coordination for the skippers are coming together. We are looking for a fun day of racing and want to thank in advance: George Schott, Karl Bohlmann and Mike Ressa for volunteering their vessels to support the Race Management Team. More on that outcome next month.

Fishing Report...

Next week water conditions should improve as we get some easterly winds to calm things down. Also the water temperature is slowly coming down which will help with the bite.

Catch and release speckled trout and redfish are available when the tide is moving. Use live greenbacks, shrimp, or small soft artificial baits. Inshore flounder, black drum, silver trout, sheepshead, and pompano are available to take home for a meal. Remember, speckled trout, redfish, and snook are strictly catch and release thru May 31st of 2021.

Offshore, both gag and red grouper are available for harvest, gags must measure 24 inches and reds 20". You will need to get out to 40 ft plus to find the grouper as they like colder water. Spanish mackerel and small kingfish can be found on any offshore structure holding bait, the larger kings should arrive in October.

Call me if you have any ideas for a fishing event. Go out on the water, be safe and have fun!

A Beginner's Guide to Free Fall, Amy Abramowitz




What Alice Forgot, Liane Moriarty




