Please join me in welcoming new Dunedin Boat Club members


Mark Middleton and Thomas Travers & Sharon Kemp-Gonzale.

How to register yourself as crew searching for a boat to race on: Over the past year several new and existing DBC members have approached DBC Race Committee asking how they might work their way onto a Sailboat that needs crew for racing. While we've had a link in the DBC website for folks to sign up, through the evolution of technology, the race management system used to manage our DBC racing activaties called Yacht Scoring now has a link for Crew looking for a Boat to crew on. If you are interested, use this link to the DBC website https://www.dunedinboatclub.org/racing-resource-library/ and read the PDF called "Guide Crew looking for a Boat". It will take you to Yacht Scoring and just follow the prompts. Here are the prompts:

- 1. Go to Yacht Scoring. Com https://www.yachtscoring.com/
- 2. Drop to the bottom and in the search box key in Dunedin.
- 3. Select the race event you want to participate in
- 4. At that event's main menu select the crew, boat charter board link in the lower right
- 5. Select the Add your name to the crew boat board
- 6. Select the option you want in the top drop-down box and save your entries before you exit






