Fishing Event...

Scallop Season is here! Pasco county opens up for scalloping from Friday July 16th thru Sunday July 25th. You will need a boat, dive flag (20x24 inches), snorkel, mask, fins, mesh catch bag, and saltwater fishing license.

Daily limit is 2 gallons per person or 10 gallons per boat in shell (5 persons or more on board). Water depth ranges from 3-6 ft deep and is extremely clear as scallops only thrive in clean water. Keep them on ice in the boat!

I will be leaving from Home Port Marina at 7:30 am and meet other boats at the end of the Marina channel to lead you to my scallop spot. Please call me 727 631-4191 if you would like to meet up for this fun event. We will be in the general area of a mile north of the Anclote River, inside the sound. Early start is to avoid the possible thunderstorms in the afternoon.

Our book selection is "As Long as We Both Shall Live," by Jo Ann Chaney.



July Highlight David Kresge

Member since 2016, Race Chairman



So, I asked myself, self, "how did you gain your passion for competitive sailing?" Well that all starts in my freshman year of high school when I was a Boy Scout working towards my Star Class on the road to Eagle while living in Hollywood, Florida. A good buddy, Bob Salmon, was working on his sailing Merit Badge and we were going to do our maiden non-instructor sail. We asked a third buddy to join us and Bobby's dad drove us on a Saturday morning down to Florida Power & Light's Turkey Point electric plant in South Miami. He had an open boat similar to a 420 and we departed Turkey Point to sail across Biscayne Bay to Elliot Key. Well, we headed out early and mid-way across the weather picked up and we began taking on water. Needless to say, the third buddy was scared it was over but we kept saying "keep bailing". We eventually got

picked up by a cruiser who towed us to Elliot Key where they called the Coast Guard who met us and brought us back to Dinner Key in South Miami for Bobby's Dad to pick us up that evening. I thought it was the most thrilling ride of my life.

Years went by and while I stayed associated with water sports, scuba diving, sailing and boating, life. Life went on and in 1985 I was asked to crew on a Ranger 23 dry sailed out of Lauderdale Yacht Club which I did and we were placing well in a good number of races. A college buddy and I partnered up in the purchase of a WD Schock – Santana 23 and we had



enough boats owners sailing out of LYC to have our own class. That got me the competitive education and I went on to crewing on C&C's, Soverells, and others in Fort Lauderdale races to West Palm Beach, Bimini, Miami, and the SORC feeder races to Key West. What a blast. Working foredeck was my home. Then life's career stepped in and I was off to Tallahassee.

Then my banking career began transferring me around the State where we eventually landed in Tampa where in early 1994, I learned about the Davis Island Yacht Club's Thursday night racing and I thought I was in heaven. Working in downtown Tampa and on Thursdays, simply drive over to DIYC to race? It was great. Ironically, on my first day there I came across the owner of our earlier mentioned Santana 23 who had bought our boat and moved it to Tampa and on that date that we met again, he had just sold the boat to a Canadian who put it on a truck to ship to Canada.

I eventually got involved with Clearwater Yacht Club's racing as crew on a few boats and did a number of Clearwater – Key West races. Theresa worked with their CYC's Race Committee. But again, my career stepped-up and moved me back to Fort Lauderdale. There I got into racing with the Gulf Stream Sailing Club until my banking retirement from that 38-year career. Theresa and I bought an RV and hit the road for 4 years.

All this to say that when we'd come to Florida to stay out of the snow with the RV, we'd reconnect with Fairlie Brinkley (former CYC member) and he asked me to get involved with DBC's racing program. Carol Elwood asked me to join Race Committee and then

handed me the role of Race Committee Chair. She and

Fairlie continue to be mentors to my formal RC role. In closing, I want to say I am having a great time with our DBC Community and the reinvigorated racing enthusiasm. It is important for the Club to continue to seek out boat owners as members and for those who are members to help with the evolution of the Dunedin Youth Sailing Program – these are our future sailors if we are going to have a racing curriculum for our Dunedin Boating Community. All of the power boaters are critical to our ability to deliver a thriving sailboat racing program. By the way, ask Theresa about her blue water sailing experience.
