Friday's race course had to be shortened due to the weather that filled in from the East yet we got no rain for the evening. How to register yourself as crew searching for a boat to race on: Over the past year several new and existing DBC members have approached DBC Race Committee asking how they might work their way onto a Sailboat that needs crew for racing. While we've had a link in the DBC website for folks to sign up, through the evolution of technology, the race management system used to manage our DBC racing activities called Yacht Scoring now has a link for Crew looking for a Boat to crew on. If you are interested, use this link to the DBC website https://www.dunedinboatclub.org/racing-resource-library/ and read the PDF called "Guide Crew looking for a Boat". It will take you to Yacht Scoring and just follow the prompts. Here are the prompts:


- 1. Go to Yacht Scoring.com https://www.yachtscoring.com/
- 2. Drop to the bottom and in the search box key in Dunedin.
- 3. Select the race event you want to participate in
- 4. At that event's main menu select the crew, boat charter board link in the lower right
- 5. Select the Add your name to the crew boat board
- 6. Select the option you want in the top drop-down box and save your entries before you exit

Fishing Report...

We will have a *Redfish event on Saturday June 26th from 8am-2pm*. You can now keep one fish per person from 18-27 inches, however I recommend keeping fish from 20-27 inches. Use 4/0 circle hooks with cut bait such as pinfish, mullet, or ladyfish on the grass flats across from our boat club near Honeymoon Island. You can also use live greenbacks or shrimp on a smaller circle hook as well as jigs that imitate a baitfish or shrimp.

You can fish from any boat including a kayak or canoe for redfish! This is a Saturday event so I want all members who fish involved. Feel free to contact me for how and where to catch redfish. In 2009 my fishing partner and I won a flats boat in the Extreme Redfish Tournament so I might know a little about catching these fish.

We will meet at the club house at 3:30pm where I will measure and filet the fish we caught. All involved, even if you did not catch anything, will enjoy fresh blackened redfish. I will cook the fish on the grill and bring a salad.

Our book selection is "Anxious People: A Novel," by Fredrik Backman.


