How to register yourself as crew searching for a boat to race on: Over the past year several new and existing DBC members have approached DBC Race Committee asking how they might work their way onto a Sailboat that needs crew for racing. While we've had a link in the DBC website for folks to sign up, through the evolution of technology, the race management system used to manage our DBC racing activities called Yacht Scoring now has a link for Crew looking for a Boat to crew on. If you are interested, use this link to the DBC website https://www.dunedinboatclub.org/racing-resource-library/ and read the PDF called "Guide Crew looking for a Boat". It will take you to Yacht Scoring and just follow the prompts. Here are the prompts:

- 1. Go to Yacht Scoring.com https://www.yachtscoring.com/
- 2. Drop to the bottom and in the search box key in Dunedin.
- 3. Select the race event you want to participate in
- 4. At that event's main menu select the crew, boat charter board link in the lower right
- 5. Select the Add your name to the crew boat board
- 6. Select the option you want in the top drop-down box and save your entries before you exit




Kayaking from Pop Stansell's Park

Fishing Report...



Last week I was able to do some pompano fishing with a friend in St Pete. We fished from a small boat at the edge of a sandbar at Bunces Pass using a small banana jig (Silly Willy jig or Docs Goofy jig) with a teaser. The key is to fish when the tide is running hard tearing small mole crabs from the sand bar. Cast onto the bar and bump the jig in the sand into the drop off at the edge of the bar. Pompano will grab the jig thinking it is a small crab or shrimp. They must be 11 inches or longer at the fork to keep and are great to eat.

Stay tuned for our next fishing event. I am planning a redfish event in June when they are legal to keep. We will also serve blackened redfish at the clubhouse after the event for those who fished! That is if we are lucky to catch them.

"A Perfect Wife: A Novel", by JP Delaney


