### **Rear Commodore**

As I am getting settled into my role as your Rear Commodore I have decided to approach this year with a strategy that I hope will benefit the entire club. I see that there are 4 steps for the year and I encourage everyone to be involved in our success.

- **Step 1** An update to the Club Operations Handbook. This lays out all the important information to keeping the club in good shape and inventorying the key assets of the club. I am please to say that this is now done and a printed copy will be available in the club, a printed copy will be made available to the Harbor Master and a copy will be online.
- **Step 2** To create a "reset" of the club and the acquired items. We will accomplish this in the first half of the year through "Good for the Club" events focused on cleaning the Attic (February 19th), followed by a morning of cleaning the main room and kitchen, and then another morning of cleaning the exterior of the building and storage cabinets (time and dates to be announced). Each of the cleaning sessions will require 5-6 to help with the work.
- **Step 3** The new focus of the Building Committee to make recommendations to the board and body regarding improvements to the club. If you are interested in helping out, please let me know!
- **Step 4** I will be documenting for the board all recommendations of the Building Committee, plus any input from the membership, and putting this into a 3 year Capital Improvement plan. The Capital Improvement Plan will be a living document, regularly updated with key projects that are prioritized based on benefit to the club, time lines, and budgetary requirements. The hope is that this will provide better visibility for the board and finance committees with budgeting going forward as well as helping with any requests that might need to go to the City for their support.

Lastly, it was decided to remove the water fountain from the building. This was adding to our rodent problem and just found to be unsanitary. Thank you to Tom Kelly for making this happen. I have also spent a couple of hours at the club plugging up some existing entry points.

## **Book Club...**


The Book Club's next meeting is **Wed.**, **March 9**, at 7pm. Sign up on the Event section of the Boat Club website.

## Fishing Report...

Well, I finally got our boat up and running and am looking forward to pulling our stone crab traps this week! Sheepshead fishing has been great! Find an old dock piling covered in barnacles, bridge, oyster bar, or rocky area to find them. Use a size 1/0 very sharp hook with fiddler or mud crab, shrimp, or barnacle to catch them.

Fish around the spoil islands for trout and redfish during a moving tide using a lead head jig and slow retrieve. After the fronts come through and the waters calm down, you will find triple tail on the crab trap buoys. Use a live shrimp, greenback, or trout jig to catch them. Triple tail must be 18 inches to keep and are great to eat.

I will put some fishing events on the club calendar and possibly due a tackle seminar. Please reach out to me and let me know what you would like to fish for during these events. Remember the water is cold so be careful and safe while fishing from a boat.

Go to the website and check out our new fishing forum. I started a discussion on equipment. Start your own or add your comments. I would like to hear what the DBC fishing enthusiast would like to see next. Go to the members section, member discussion forums, then fishing. See you there!

Claudia and I really enjoy the Insight section of the Harbor Crier as it provides a great way to learn about the amazing members of our great club. Suffice it to say, I am honored that Jeanine asked me to contribute to this article.

My dad was very fond of saying (insert heavy Texan drawl), "You know son, it is no coincidence that you were born in Roswell (New Mexico)" When oil was discovered on the North Slope of Alaska, we packed up the truck and moved to Anchorage, Alaska. The move to Alaska was instrumental in establishing a lifelong love of outdoors and nature. It also set in motion a life spent either in, on or under the water.

My first boat was a 12' Sunfish sailboat that occupied my summers growing up on the lakes of Alaska. You have not experienced cold until you have capsized the boat in September! I later graduated to a larger sailboat where I crewed a Christina 52 sailboat (Hans Christian). I learned several things over the course of this experience. First, under the leadership and mentorship of my dad, I learned boating safety, accountability, and integrity. Second, sailing is hard work hence the need for power and speed later in life. Finally, it is more fun being the captain vice the mate. I learned a lot from my dad and we have inherited his boating book collection to include pre-global position system (GPS) editions

of Dutton and Bowditch which are not very useful these days but sure look good on the bookshelf.

Several years later, I made a pivotal decision to join the US Navy and become a Submarine Warfare qualified Officer. There were a number of influences in the course of this decision to include my dad, Ronald Reagan and Tom Clancy. My Dad spent several years in the Navy during World War II flying Torpedo Bombers in the Pacific Theatre and later, he was called back as a flight instructor in support of the Korean War. President Reagan inspired an entire generation with his vision to increase the size of the fleet to six hundred ships, and he nearly made it; and finally, Tom Clancy told a really great story and made Submarining sound glamorous. Little did I know at the time that this decision would provide some of the most challenging and rewarding adventures of my life.





Over the course of my navy career where I retired as a Navy Commander, I had the privilege and honor to serve on three fast attack nuclear powered submarine to include the USS Greenling (SSN 614), USS La Jolla (SSN 701), and the USS Buffalo (SSN 715). Additionally, I served on the USS Constellation Battle Group staff as the senior Submariner in charge of the Submarines assigned to the battle group while deployed to the Persian Gulf. I spent over half of my career at sea and this is what solidified my passion for all things maritime. My service instilled a profound respect for preventive maintenance, material condition, attention to detail, and safe ship operation. As it turns out, these are all very closely related and have served me well in my transition from service to current day.

When we moved to Dunedin in January 2020, I was hired to crew the Caladesi Ferry and last year earned my USCG 100GT Near Coastal Master credential. My lovely wife Claudia and I recently purchased a 2005 SeaRay MY 390 with twin Cummins 480 diesels (reference above need for speed and power) which we hope to take on the Great Loop in the foreseeable future (two-year plan).



They say that things happen for a reason, and I certainly believe that is the case with our preparedness for the next great adventures. My Navy career prepared me to not only operate safely in two dimensions, but it also prepared me to operate safely in the third dimension if needed....and I sincerely hope that will not be the case anytime soon. Finally, I could not have asked for a better person to share this adventure with than Claudia; my best friend, partner in crime and lovely wife of almost 19 years.

In closing, my goal in sharing this article, is to provide the readers with insight on how our experiences shape our future. Second, pursuing your passion and enjoying what you do are the real keys to success. And finally, the friendships that you make are what makes the journey so special. Claudia and I have found those friendships at Dunedin Boat Club and are proud to be a part of this great group.


