



# Fishing Report...

Pompano, one of the tastiest fish that swims in our area, are now available in our inlets! To find these great tasting hard fighting fish, cast from the jetty or beach on a moving tide using a banana jig and teaser. You can also use a boat and drift the passes to catch these fish. Brand names for the jigs are Silly Willy and Docs Goofy Jigs, remember to add the teaser hook with bucktail. Tie them on a 20 pound leader using a loop knot to provide better action. Cast out and after the jig hits the bottom, give it a steady sharp jerk and slow retrieve. Pompano are looking for small sand fleas (mole crabs), shrimp, or anything else that the current pulls out of the sand. Pompano must be 11 inches at the fork to keep, with a bag limit of 6 fish. You can also catch them off the beach using sand fleas or shrimp if you prefer to use bait. Pompano are schooling fish so if you catch one more are there. Moving tide either incoming or outgoing is a must, they will not feed on a slack tide. Get out there and fish! I would like to hear what the DBC fishing enthusiast would like to see next. # Insights...



April Highlight
Bill Goocher
2015

I grew up on a small farm in the extreme southwest corner of Georgia, near Lake Seminole. On our farm, we raised cattle, peanuts, corn, cotton, and a variety of other animals and crops over the years. To locate Lake Seminole on a map, follow the Apalachicola River north to the Georgia/Florida state line. At the state line is the Jim Woodruff Lock and Dam. On the other side of the dam is Lake Seminole. The dam forms Lake Seminole by backing up the Chattahoochee River flowing from the North and the Flint River flowing from the Northeast.

My love of boating started at an early age. I was fortunate that my Dad enjoyed boating, especially fishing. We had a small plywood fishing boat (similar to the one in the picture, but hunter green in color) with a whopping 7 HP Evinrude engine. To go in reverse, you manually turned the engine around backward. When we had free time from our chores on the farm, my Dad would take my brother and me fishing on Lake Seminole. Fishing with my Dad and brother on Lake Seminole, and later with my buddies in high school, will forever be fond memories from my childhood.



When I was about 10 years old, Dad purchased a used Chris Craft ski boat (again, similar to the one in the picture and was painted white). The Chris Craft had a 35 HP Evinrude engine. It doesn't sound like a very big engine by today's standards, but a 35 HP outboard engine in those days was about the size of a washing machine and would pull up 2 skiers at once! Needless to say, we were either fishing or skiing on Lake Seminole whenever we could get away from farm work.

After high school, I moved to Atlanta, attended Georgia State University, and started a career in a relatively new field called computer software. Over the next 40 years or so I worked in the Enterprise Software industry in a wide variety of marketing, sales, and executive leadership positions and traveled extensively with work. One job promotion required a move from Atlanta to Hermosa Beach, California (LA area). While in Southern California I was missing boating and being on the water. To get back on the water I did two things:

1. I completed a program with the American Cetacean Society (ACS) and became a volunteer docent on the whale watch boats in the LA area. It was a blast to be on the water, educating people about whales, dolphins, and the local waters. What was even more rewarding was to see the kids' (and adult) faces on the boats when they saw their first whale. If you are interested in learning more about whales, buy me a beer at the next DBC event and I will fill your ear. Whales are incredible animals!!

2. I took up a sport I had wanted to try for many years, SCUBA diving. In addition to many warm water dive vacations, I also dove year-round in the chilly waters off Southern CA, where water temps average 58-60 degrees year-round. My favorite SCUBA vacation ever was a 10-day liveaboard trip to Cocos Island. Cocos is a 36 hour steam into the Pacific off the coast of Costa Rica. The diving was incredible with literally 100's of hammerhead and white tip sharks on every dive, not to mention the other big animals. The attached pics are a few I took on that trip.







In 2002, after living in the LA area for 14 years and going through a divorce, I decided to move back East and choose Tampa. After being in Tampa for ~1 year, I met a beautiful Greek gal on Match.com. Her name was Cathy Konstantatos. During the following year, we bought our first home in Dunedin and got married in Clearwater Beach. 2022 will be our 17<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary.

While I continued to enjoy dive trips to South Florida, the Keys, and dive vacations in the Caribbean, I longed to be on the water on my own boat. For our first Florida boat, Cathy and I purchased a Rinker 23' bowrider. It was a great boat and we enjoyed it for ~10 years exploring the local waters as well as trailering it to the Keys on a few occasions.

In 2015 we were fortunate to join the Dunedin Boat. We immediately fell in love with the comradery, activities, and people. Since joining DBC, I served as Membership Chair for 3 years, Board Member for 3 Years, and currently serve as Vice Commodore. In addition to many volunteer activities, Cathy has been in the Book Club since we joined the club (hosting on several occasions) and served as the DBC Secretary in 2020. Needless to say, we thoroughly enjoy the Dunedin Boat Club and the great friends we have made over the past few years.





After joining DBC, we met several members who were into Cruising. After becoming involved with the Cruiser group, we decided to purchase a 34' Cruisers Yacht. We kept that boat for just over 2 years, did a few cruises, and spent several weekends at Caladesi.

Ultimately, we decided we liked the flexibility of a smaller boat to enjoy the local waters, diving, and fishing. As a result, we sold the cruiser and are currently looking for a center console in the 27' range.

I will wrap this article with a brief message to the newer members and some of the other members who are not as active in theclub. Cathy and I found that the more involved we became in DBC activities and volunteer opportunities, the more we fell in love with the club. I hope you will become actively involved in the events, volunteer every chance you get, and have the same great Dunedin Boat Club experience!!


