


Book Club...

Fishing Report...

Stone crab season has ended and all traps should have been removed from the water by now! Snook are on the beaches very close to shore. Early morning and evening hours during a moving tide are best for catching snook. Live pigfish, pinfish, grunts, whiting, and greenbacks on a circle hook sized to match your bait is your ticket to success! They will also take fish imitation lures and jigs, just remember they will be in shin to waist deep water. Snook are catch and release now until September, so carefully release all you catch. Redfish are available on oyster bars and around mangroves using cut bait or live greenbacks. Chunks of ladyfish, mullet, or pinfish work very well on a 4/o circle hook. One fish, 18 to 27 inches may be kept, however I would not keep any redfish less than 20 inches. If you have kids take them to the beach with some frozen shrimp on a #2 hook with sinker to catch tasty whiting. Remember to fish the cuts troughs in the surf to find them.

Towards the end of October our club will work with the Rotary club to do a benefit flats fishing tournament. We will need volunteers to help, so please let me know if you would like to help. Stay tuned for more info about this.

"Hello and welcome aboard the Caladesi Connection. I'm Captain Dave and I'll be your skipper today!" That's my standard greeting as one of the captains for the Caladesi Island ferry service. I have been enjoying shuttling visitors to the island back and forth for 4 years now ever since I achieved my master captains license and my now deceased friend Phil Henderson, owner of the ferry service, asked me to help out occasionally which has now turned in to a 2-3 days per week gig. When I'm not running the ferry I oversee operations as a partner in the Beso Del Sol Resort development here in Dunedin along with 3 other boutique vacation resorts located in Southern CA, Gatlinburg, TN and Breckenridge, CO.

Born and raised on the Chesapeake Bay in Annapolis, MD, and the grandson of a lighthouse keeper, one could say I have saltwater, or at least brackish water in my veins. I spent my youth crabbing, fishing and clamming on the Bay from my 14 foot wooden row boat powered by a 7.5 HP outboard.



While attending the University of MD I took a gap year and traveled to St Croix, USVI where I worked managing a small vacation rental property, tending bar and mating for a Buck Island snorkel tour boat. Those were precarious times for a 20 year old, a bottle of Cruzan Rum cost less than a Big Mac back then!

Following my island adventure I returned to reality and began working as a property manager for a large commercial real estate firm in Washington, DC, which is where I met Pam, my wife of 40 years. Her dad, my coworker, introduced us. He thought I seemed like a nice young man. My property management career spanned 23 years as company vice president overseeing management of 20,000 residential apartment units and 2 million sq ft of commercial real estate.



Pam and I were married in Annapolis, MD where we were blessed with 2 wonderful daughters, Sommer and Carly. We raised our girls on the Severn River where we owned several boats; bow riders, ski and fishing boats, for running up the river to Annapolis on summer weekends. We used to love anchoring off the US Naval Academy in May of each year to watch the Navy Blue Angels flight demonstration honoring the graduating midshipmen.

In 2007 I partnered with the owner of Global Connections, a private vacation club, and we began developing small resort properties throughout the US which is what lead us to Dunedin. 


