NOTE 1: Your old key will no longer work after this meeting.


NOTE 2: If you lost your old key, there will be \$5.00 replacement fee.

The **Blessing of the Fleet** is a tradition that began centuries ago in Mediterranean fishing communities. The practice began predominantly Catholic, but is now practiced by all Christians as a blessing from the local priest and pastors that is meant to ensure a safe and bountiful season.

In most ports, the event was brought by immigrants who held strongly to their Christian religious beliefs. The events that are part of the ritual vary by community and range from a simple ceremony to a multi-day festival including a church service, Parades, Pageantry, Dancing, Feasting, and Contests.


Thank you, John, for making everything fun and we love your smile and scotch whisky.

# Fishing Report...



Fishing in between the cold fronts when the wind dies down and the sun is out to warm up the water is producing fish. Make sure the tide is moving and fish drop offs by grass beds or oyster beds to find the fish. We caught the fish pictured using jigs with paddle tails. Trout and an occasional red fish will take these lures. Please remember to wet your hands before handling trout to release, failure to do so can cause the protective slime layer to come off allowing disease to kill these fish.

Now is the time to find sheepshead around dock pilings, bridges, rocky areas and oyster beds. Use a strong number 1 or 2 hook and shrimps or fiddler crabs to catch these fish. These fish are great fighters and great to eat due to their crustacean diet.

Get out there and catch some fresh seafood!


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
