


Steven Donovan Celebration of Life

Race Committee...

The 2nd race of the 2024 Gulf Spring Series was, March 30th. We had the best winds since I have been chair, so everyone was in high spirits. 1st place was 18 Degrees North, 2nd was Island Hopper (Captain Carol Elwood) and 3rd place was Mar Y Sol (Captain Dave Kelly). Thank you to our Race Committee Captain Bill Goocher!

The Final race of the Spring Series was last weekend, April 13th, results will be posted next month.

The next series for the late Spring are the Bay Series, which take place off the pier outside DBC. The first race is the end of May.

What does the Signal Boat (Race Committee Boat) do on race day? The race is on the Gulf of Mexico, approximately 1.5 nautical miles south of Clearwater Pass channel. The Race Committee runs the race from the Signal Boat. If there isn't a Mark Boat, the Signal Boat drops the racing marks and the start/finish line pin, to set the racecourse. Not to worry, the Race Committee is there to coach the captain on what to do. The Race Committee handles the start and finish of the race, and then the Signal Boat picks up the marks and pin at the end of the race. It is a pleasant day on the water watching sailboats race!

The Mark Boat drops the Marks on pre-determined coordinates that can be pre-loaded to make the dropping of the marks easier. We try to add an experienced person for a first time Mark Boat Captain. The Mark Boat assists the Race Committee if the Marks need to be moved for any reason during the race.

Book Club...


The Book Club's next meeting is **Wed.**, **May 8**, at 7pm. Sign up on the Events section of the Boat Club website.

Fishing Report...

Spanish Mackerel

Stone crab season ends May 1st so make sure you remove your traps by season end. I have been catching a lot of females with eggs which must be released without taking their claws.


When the winds calm down, fish just offshore for Spanish mackerel and kingfish using live bait or troll with spoons. Watch for birds diving on baitfish to find the macks! If you filet your mackerel and remove the dark area, they are excellent to eat. They can also be smoked and make a great fish spread.

Pompano are running the beaches and inlets now, use a banana jig with teaser during a moving tide to find these hard fighting tasty fish. The must be a minimum of 11 inches measured at the fork of their tail to keep!

Trout can be found on the flats using paddle tail jigs, remember to wet your hands before handling these fish if you intend to release them. Three fish 16 inches and over are allowed to be kept with only one over 19 inches. Get out there and fish!
